Connect your printer to Google Cloud Print

In order to print using the [Google Cloud Print](#), first connect your printer to the service. Google Cloud Print can print to either a [Cloud Ready printer](#) that can connect directly to the Internet or a [Classic printer](#) that is plugged into a Windows or Mac computer with Internet access.

Before connecting your cloud printer, confirm if you have:


- [Google Chrome](#).
- Windows or Mac computer
- [Download Google's Cloud Print Service](#)



Connect a Classic printer

To connect your classic printer, enable the Google Cloud Print connector using a Windows or Mac computer that's connected to the printer. You'll need [Google Chrome](#) to be installed on the computer.

Once Google Chrome is installed, follow the steps below to enable the Google Cloud Print connector in Google Chrome.

1. Turn your printer on.
2. Log in to your user account on the Windows or Mac computer.
3. Open Google Chrome.
4. Click the Chrome menu  on the browser toolbar.
5. Select **Settings**.
6. Click **Show advanced settings**.
7. Scroll down to the “Google Cloud Print” section. Click **Add printers**.
8. If prompted, sign in with your Google Account.
9. Select the printers you want to connect, and then click **Add printer(s)**.


The printer is now associated with your Google Account and connected to Google Cloud Print. You can print to this printer whenever you're signed in with the same Google Account.

Connect an Android device to a printer

1. Open **Settings** .
2. Under “System,” select **Printing**> **Cloud Print**.
3. Click **Options**
4. Select **Add Printer**
